

Lizann Schultz

Lizann graduated in 1975 from Andrew Jackson HS in Portland. She was a four-year letter winner in track and field, lettered two years in Volleyball and one year in basketball at Jackson HS. She was involved in numerous activities at Jackson including: editor of the yearbook, choir, President of Girls' League, selected as Outstanding Senior Girl Athlete in 1975 and a member of the National Honor Society.

While attending Portland State University, Lizann competed in basketball, volleyball track and field. A four-year national qualifier in the shot and discus, Lizann won the NCWSA Southern Area discus championship in 1977. She currently holds the school record in the discus at PSU. Lizann began her teaching and coaching career in 1979 at Dayton HS. This thirty-two year span included her serving as the head Volleyball coach for thirty years, and twenty-one years as the schools athletic director. Her Volleyball teams won thirteen West Valley League championships. The teams placed second three times and took third place twice in the OSAA state championships. She served as District Volleyball Chairperson for eleven-years.

In her role as athletic director, Lizann was the 3A Classification Representative on the OADA Executive Board for three years. She served as district chairperson for wrestling and track/field championships. A certified trainer for the American Sport Education Program (ASEP), Lizann became a Certified Athletic Administrator through the NIAAA. She served two terms as West Valley League President. Lizann was chosen OADA 3A and 1A-2A-3A Athletic Director of the Year in 2011. Since her retirement in 2011, Lizann has continued to stay involved in high school activities. She is a USVBA Level 1 Certified Volleyball Official. She has also served on the Officials Recruitment and Retention Committee for the OSAA
